



Egg Cozies

Easter Knitting with Yarn Leftovers

Our family likes eating eggs for breakfast on the weekends. Since Easter is coming soon, I want to share a pattern for these colorful egg cozies to brighten up the breakfast table.

Leftover yarns (CYCA #1, fingering, approx. 186 yd/170 m / 50 gram):

Purple
Pink
Orange
Lime
Yellow
White

Needles: U.S. size 2.5 / 3 mm: set of 5 dpn

With orange, CO 32 sts. Divide sts onto 4 dpn and join.

Knit 2 rnds with orange.

Next rnd: (K2 purple, k2 lime) around.

Next 5 rnds: (K2 purple, p2 lime) around.


Knit 2 rnds with pink.

Knit 2 rnds with yellow.

Purl 1 rnd with yellow.
Knit 1 rnd with yellow.
Knit 1 rnd with white.
Next rnd: (K3 white, k1 pink) around.
Knit 2 rnds with white.
Next rnd: (K1 white, k1 pink, k2 white) around.
Knit 2 rnds with white.
Next rnd: (K3 white, k1 pink) around.
Knit 1 rnd with white.
Decrease rnd: With white: K3 , (k2tog, k2) around; end by knitting the last st together with the first st on the next rnd.
Next rnd: (K1 pink, k2 white) around.
Knit 1 rnd with white.
Cut yarn and draw end through remaining sts; tighten.

Weave in all ends neatly on WS.

Make the other egg cozies the same way but vary the color sequences.
